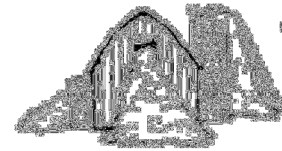

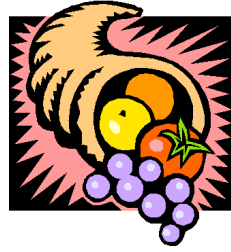

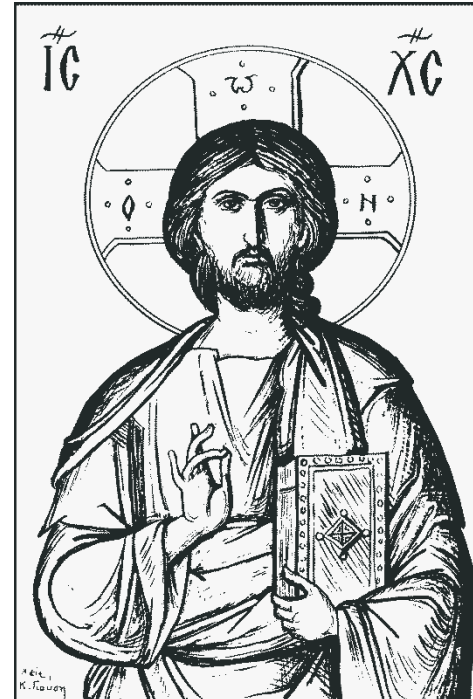
Happy Thanksgiving Day!
