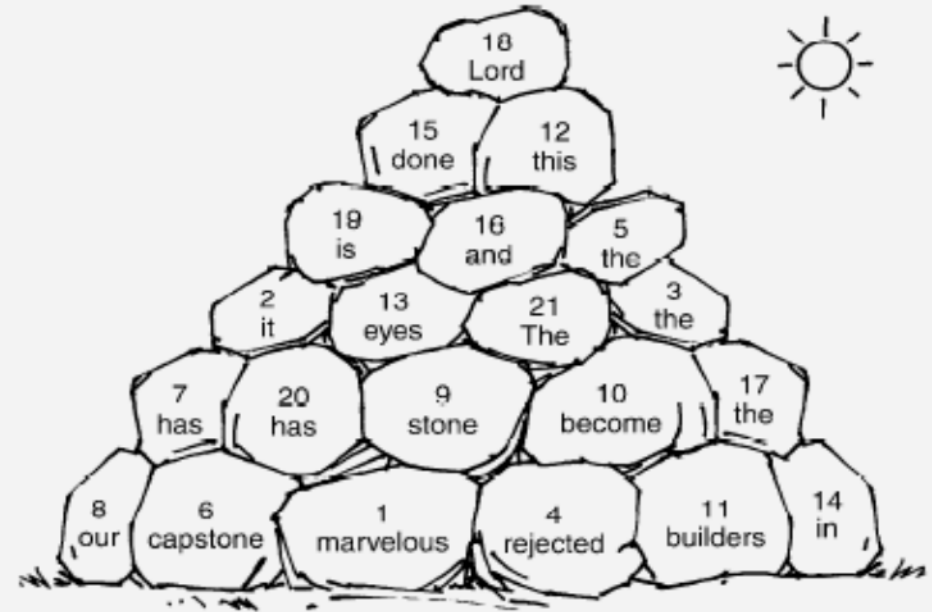

This year join us as we reach out to the wonderful men and women in the Armed Forces of our nation under God. As a parish let us collect different items that are needed and will be shipped over to bring a smile to these brave men and women during this holiday season.

There are non-food items and food-items that you can choose from. These items will be collected in our Church vestibule next to our Angel Tree. The last day to bring your gift donation will be Sunday, December 22nd.

Here are some of the items that you can donate. A full list of the items is available on the table next to our Angel Tree.

Non-Food Items: Sheet sets, Blankets, Pillows, Towels, Phone cards, AA and AAA Batteries, Books and Magazines, Scented candles, Handheld electronic games, travel sizes games, DVD's of movies/shows, zip lock bags, fly strips and mosquito coils, envelopes, pens.

Food Items: candy, licorice, lollipops (not chocolate candy), pretzels, chips, nuts, cookies, granola bars/breakfast bars, microwave popcorn, beef jerky, gum.
