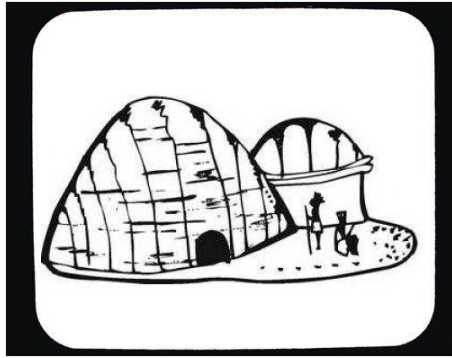

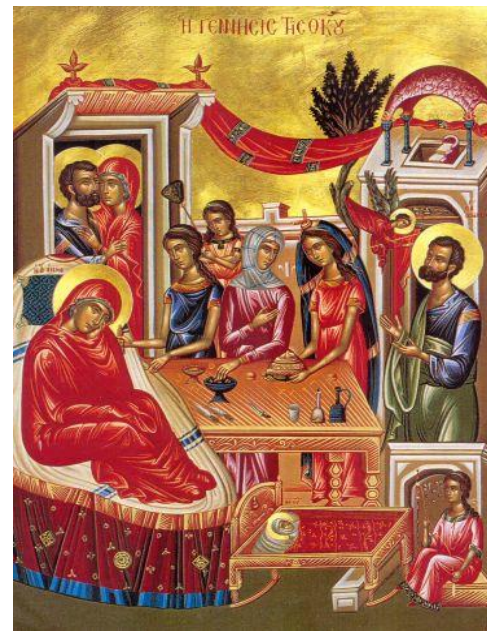

Remember that the next time your little hut seems to be burning to the ground. It just may be a smoke signal that summons the Grace of God.

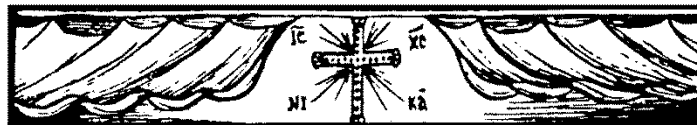
