#### The Gerasene Demoniac

At that time, as Jesus arrived at the country of the Gerasenes, there met him a man from the city who had demons; for a long time he had worn no clothes and he lived not in a house but among the tombs...

To demonstrate his authority over all things, today's Gospel reading relates the story of Our Lord healing a man possessed by many demons in a territory inhabited by Gentiles. He dramatically transforms the human life of a man by ordering the demons to leave him.

The man is said to be "possessed" by demons. This English term is too strong. In the original Greek verse 27 says he "had" demons and verse 36 says he was "demonized." Our understanding of demonic possession, even replacing a person's personality, is foreign to the New Testament.

The unclean spirit is actually many demons. When Jesus asks its name, the answer is "Legion." The Roman legion at this time consisted of 5,000 to 6,000 foot soldiers, and so the name implies a large number of demons.

The local people are terrified by what has happened. Their fear does not lead to praise of God, but rejection of Jesus. The healed man wants to follow Jesus as a disciple, but his vocation is to share what has happened to him with his own people.

By healing a Gentile, Our Lord demonstrates that His message is not only for Israel but for the whole worlds, including us today. We, too, should take the healing of sin that we receive through His resurrection, and through the reception of the Holy Mysteries-Sacraments, and proclaim this to all with whom we have daily contact.

Make an effort, then, to meet more frequently to celebrate God's Eucharist and to offer praise. For, when you meet frequently in the same place, the forces of Satan are overthrown, and his baneful influence is neutralized by the unanimity of your faith. Peace is a precious thing: it puts an end to every war waged by heavenly or earthly enemies.
