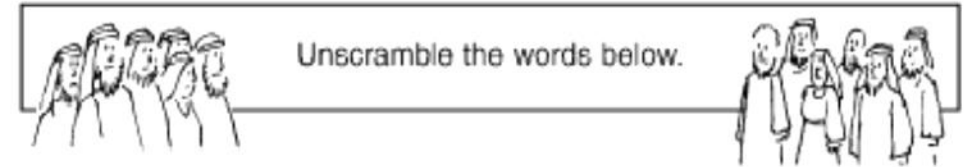
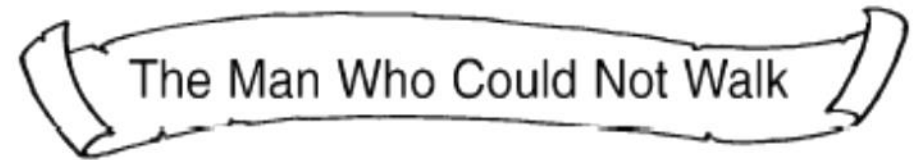

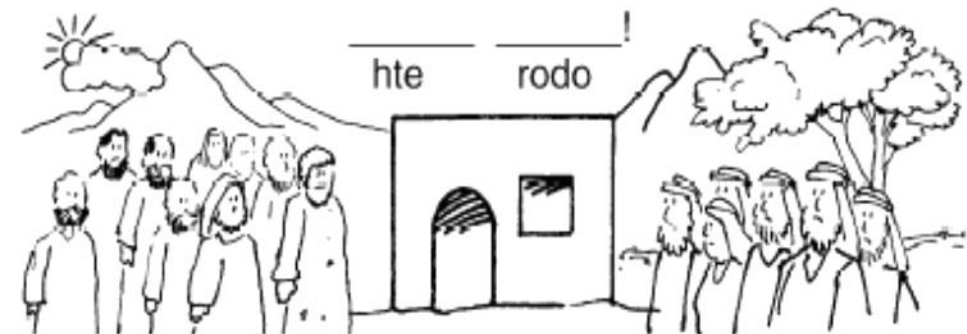

### Just a Tap on the Shoulder...

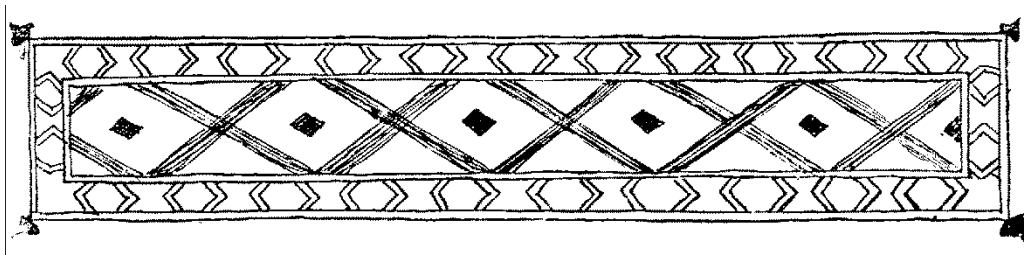

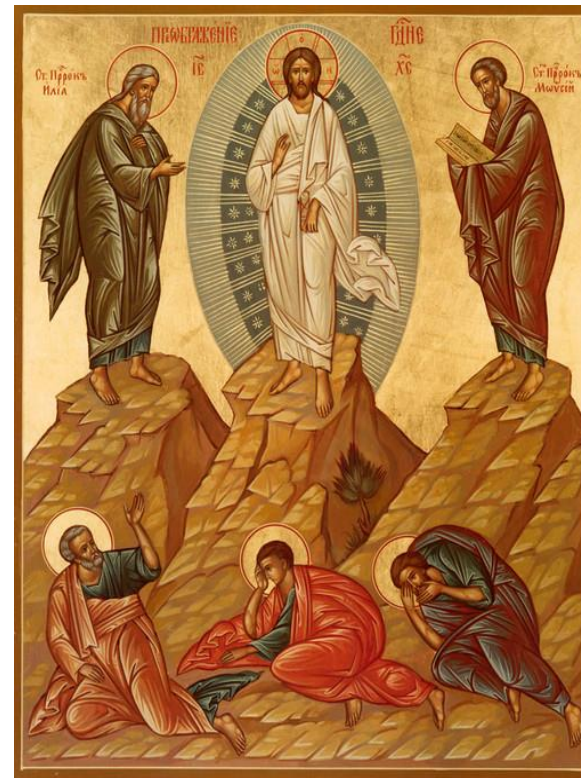
### Kids and God

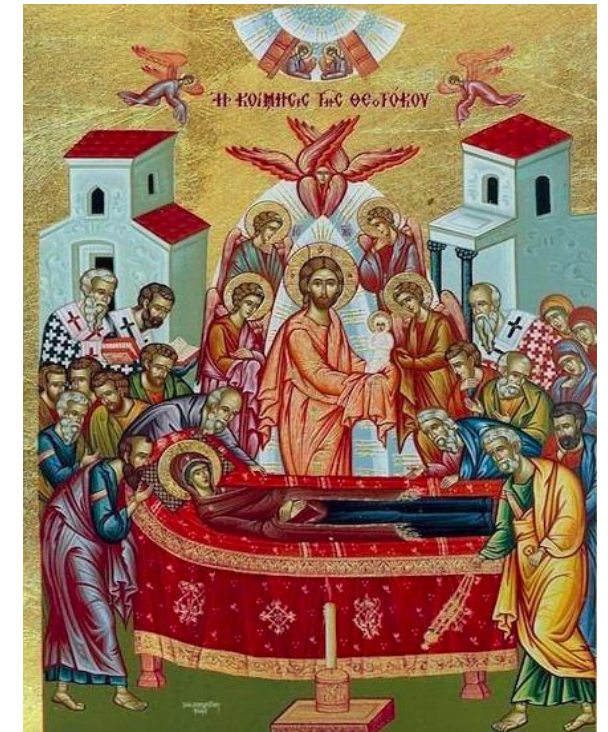
