## ON DRAWING CLOSER TO GOD




## **Announcements:**

### **Dormition Fast**

On Wednesday, August 1<sup>st</sup>, we begin in our Holy Church the Dormition Fast—"Spasiwka". This Fast begins August 1<sup>st</sup> and ends on August 14<sup>th</sup>, and is a time of preparation for the Feast of the Dormition-Falling Asleep of the Mother of God. This great Feast of the Dormition is also called the Summer Pascha as it commemorates the death, burial, resurrection, and ascension of the Virgin Mary. During this upcoming Dormition Fast-Spasiwka, plan to also attend the special Divine Services, honoring the Most Holy Theotokos.

### **Feast of the Transfiguration**

On Monday, August 6<sup>th</sup>, we will celebrate the Holy Transfiguration of Our Lord. To celebrate this Major Feast Day we will have a Vespereal Divine Liturgy with the Blessing of the Fruit at 7:00 p.m. at St. George's parish, North Side. If you wish to have your fruit blessed (at any of the Divine Services this week), please place them in the center of the Church on the Tetrapod.



### **The Holy Great-martyr and Healer Panteleimon**

**July 27**

*You imitated the merciful Lord and he bestowed upon you the grace of healing. O sharer in the Passion, O martyr of Christ our God, through your prayers heal the ills of our souls. Always drive away far from us the seductive enemy as with confidence we cry out: Save us, O Lord.*



The holy great martyr Panteleimon had Nicomedia as his homeland, and was the son of Eustorgius and Eubula. His father was an idolater, but his mother was a Christian from her ancestors. It was through her that he was instructed in piety, and still later, he was catechized in the Faith of Christ by Saint Hermolaus and baptized by him. Being proficient in the physician's vocation, he practiced it in a philanthropic manner, healing every illness more by the grace of Christ than by medicines. Thus, although his parents had named him Pantoleon ("in all things a lion"), because of the compassion he showed for the souls and bodies of all, he was worthily renamed Panteleimon, meaning "all-merciful."

On one occasion, when he restored the sight of a certain blind man by calling on the Divine Name, he enlightened also the eyes of this man's soul to the knowledge of the truth. This also became the cause for the martyrdom of him who had been blind, since when he was asked by whom and in what manner his eyes had been opened, in imitation of that blind man of the Gospel he confessed with boldness both who the physician was and the manner of his healing. For this he was put to death immediately. Panteleimon was arrested also, and having endured many wounds, he was finally beheaded in the year 305, during the reign of Maximian. Saint Panteleimon is one of the Holy Unmercenaries, and is held in special honor among them, even as Saint George is among the Martyrs. O holy sharer in the Passion and healer, Panteleimon, pray the God of mercies to grant our souls forgiveness of sins!
