**MIDFEAST OF PENTECOST**



The time of Pentecost is 50 days. Indeed, the word Pentecost means “fifty.” In the middle of the feast that is on the 25th day, which is always a Wednesday, we celebrate the feast known as Mid-Pentecost. The feast unites and connects Pascha (the beginning) with Pentecost (the ending).

The symbol of water provides the theme for the feast of Mid-Pentecost. “Whoever is thirsty should come to Me and drink.” As the Scriptures says, “Whoever believes in Me, streams of life giving water will pour out from his heart.” Christ said this about the Spirit which those who believe in Him were going to receive (John 7:37-38). This passage is also part of the Gospel reading for the Sunday of Pentecost.

Anticipating the gift of the Holy Spirit by Christ, the Troparion of Mid-Pentecost express the yearning of the believer with these words:

*In the middle of the Feast, O Savior, fill my thirsting soul with the waters of godliness, as Thou didst cry to all: If anyone thirsts let him come to Me and drink! O Christ God, Fountain of our life, glory to Thee!*

**Today: Sunday of the Paralytic Man**

We celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Pascha which is dedicated to Christ’s healing of the Paralytic Man of which we read in today’s Gospel reading from John 5: 1-15. The man is healed by Christ while waiting to be put down into the pool of water. Through Baptism in the Church we, too, are healed and saved by Christ for eternal life. Thus, in the Church, we are told, together with the paralytic, to “sin no more that nothing worse befall you”.
